Covid Vaccination Update

The following email will be sent to CRPUSD families at 3:00pm today, regarding the update on COVID vaccinations.

We have received important news to share with you regarding the bill requiring student vaccinations against COVID-19. The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) <u>announced yesterday</u> evening that it will postpone the regulatory process used to require COVID vaccinations for public and private school attendance.

Covid Vaccination Update cont:.....

The requirement, which was expected to go into effect for the 2022–23 school year on July 1, 2022, will not be implemented until after full federal Food and Drug Administration approval and no sooner than July 1, 2023. The department's decision takes into consideration that full approval for the vaccine for individuals of all ages within the 7–12 grade span has not yet been granted by the FDA.
