School Vision Statement

School Description: Richard Crane Elementary is a year-round school with a population of approximately 192 students located in the C section of the Cotati Rohnert Park Unified School District. Richard Crane was reopened in the 2017 -2018 school year. All instruction is based on the Common Core Standards. To teach and address the social emotional needs of our students we use the Second-Step and Second Step Bulling curriculum. Additionally, we are beginning year one of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). Behavioral expectations are modeled, clearly taught and students are commended for being respectful, safe and responsible. Monthly assemblies recognize students who demonstrate positive student behavior. School wide procedures and expectations provide a safe and orderly learning environment. To help ensure all students are successful academically, physically, socially and emotionally we support our students by focusing on effective first instruction, our Response to Intervention program, Walk To Read, mindfulness, and by teaching the Second Step Program school wide. Richard Crane is focused on creating a school culture that is caring and safe, and students are permitted to take academic risks so students are ready to learn. We are building partnerships with Rancho Cotate High School, our school community, and our larger community. Richard Crane's PTA plays a vital role in engaging parents, students and teachers as we work together to enrich our students' experiences through supporting programs and activities. The funds raised through the PTA have enabled us to offer Drama Club, a School-wide play, participation in the County Spelling Bee, school assemblies and community building Family Fun Nights. In addition, the PTA has purchased robotic sets and recess and PE equipment for our students. Our Cougar Cub pride can be seen everyday throughout our campus.

Vision: Our vision at Richard Crane Elementary is to provide a rich educational environment where all students are fully engaged in their learning. We believe it is critical for elementary school students to excel academically, emotionally, socially, and physically in order to grow into thriving students. These foundational beliefs are implemented into the teaching and learning for our students and define our school community. "A community where students are nurtured and empowered to excel as lifelong learners."

Mission: At Richard Crane Year Round Elementary School we are focused on meeting the unique needs of every student. We established practices that support the learning of the whole child to enable students to reach their learning potential. Through project based learning (PBL) and experiential activities, students explore the real work by thinking critically, collaborating, creating and communicating their understanding through a variety of methods. When our students promote to middle school, they will be empowered to succeed at high levels.

Conclusions from Data:

Using the information from our 2017 – 2018 California Healthy Kids survey, current attendance and suspension rates we will now be able to look for trends and needs. 100% of our 5th grade students participated in the 2019 - 2020 California Healthy Kids survey. We are awaiting these results. On the 2017 – 18 CHKS, 100% of the 5th grade students who participated stated that teachers treat students fairly at school all or most of the time. 100% of the 5th graders also felt that adults at school want them to do their best most or all of the time. 46% of the 5th graders stated they do not always feel safe coming to and from school. In 2017 – 2018, Richard Crane had 1.3% overall suspension rate. In 2018 – 2019 the total suspensions increased to 3.9%. Richard Crane's Chronic Attendance Rate for the 17-18 school year was 9%. In 2018 – 2019 it increased to 9.6%

Conclusions from Parent, Teacher and Student Input:

We have a through system for tracking and intervening when truancy begin. To decrease the number of students who are chronically absent we will be recognizing students each trimester for perfect attendance. Richard Crane's Chronic Attendance Rate for the 17-18 school year was 9%. The Chronic Absenteeism rate for 2018 – 2019 is 9.6% which is an increase of .6%. Our school in partnership with Community Matters formed a Whole School 360 team this year. Our team met for two days to put together an action plan to address chronic absenteeism, suspensions as well as school culture. Our plan includes updating our school handbook, making stronger connections with Seneca/Keeping Kids in School and our School Resource Officer.

In response to the 17 – 18 data that stated 46% of the 5th graders said they do not always feel safe coming to and from school Richard Crane has participated in the Safe Routes to School program. In the 2018 – 19 School year our second and third grade classes participated in the Pedestrian Safety program. In the 2018 - 2019 school year our fourth and fifth grade classes participated in the bicycle safety program culminating in a bicycle rodeo. In the 2019 – 2020 school year our 2nd graders will participate in the Pedestrian Safety Program and our fourth and fifth graders will participate in the bicycle safety program. As a school we participate in Walk and Roll to School the first Wednesday of every month. Safe Routes to school created a map showing where are student live in relationship to the school. Safe Routes to School has also been a resource to our families at our Showcase Night.

Richard Crane had 3.9% overall suspension rate which is an increase from the previous year. Richard Crane's Chronic Attendance Rate for the 17-18 school year was 9%. Our school is also in year one (last year's work is counted as year 0) of implementing Positive Behaviors Interventions and Strategies school wide. We are implementing Positive Behavioral Interventions Supports tier 1 this year. Our hope is that we can reduce the amount of office referrals and suspensions by supporting our students will clear expectations school wide.

As a new school beginning our second year, we are proud of our community. We have had strong attendance at our Back To School Night, Family Fun Nights and Fall Festival. We had numerous parent volunteers at our Walk-a-thon. In addition, we are excited about the learning environment that our school is able to provide to meet the needs of our learners while teaching them to be responsible and engaged in their learning. The integrated technology and the flexible learning spaces allow for students to focus and remain engaged. The learning spaces provide expanded opportunities for student and teacher collaboration. We are proud of our Social Emotional curriculum that encompasses mindfulness, Second Step, Second Step Bullying Curriculum, Growth Mindset and Responsive Classrooms. Our Walk To Read Program and RTI groups support our students academically. Teachers are incorporating Project Based Learning to make the learning rigorous and meaningful. This year our school is implementing year 1 of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). School wide behavior expectations are taught, reviewed and modeled so that students know what is expected of them in all areas of the school. Our school's PBIS team meets on a regular basis to help support the implementation of PBIS.
